JOINT EXECUTIVE ORDER REGARDING SOCIAL DISTANCING PRACTICES IN PUBLIC-FACING BUSINESSES

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2020, Governor Andy Beshear declared a State of Emergency in Kentucky in response to the first documented case of Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald J. Trump declared a National State of Emergency in response to the Coronavirus, COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Lawrence County Judge Executive Phillip Carter and Louisa Mayor Harold Slone declared a State of Emergency in Lawrence County and City of Louisa in response to the Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result on serious illness or death and can easily spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, all Lawrence County/City of Louisa residents are encouraged to stay home unless absolutely necessary; and

WHEREAS, to further limit person to person contact due to the spread of this dangerous virus, the undersigned find it necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Lawrence County and City of Louisa;


NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of maintaining social distancing under the CDC Guidelines and to promote the health and well-being of the general public to reduce the community spread of virus, in response to the Novel Coronavirus, COVID-19; and pursuant to KRS Chapter 39A and 39B; and to promote and secure the safety and protection of the civilian population in Lawrence County and City of Louisa, by virtue and powers and authorized vested in us as Lawrence County Judge Executive and Mayor of the City of Louisa pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 39A and 39B, and Executive Orders issued by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and do **HEREBY ORDER THE FOLLOWING**:

- 1- In addition to travel restrictions ordered by Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear's Executive Order 2020-266 section 8 and 9 anyone coming to reside or stay in Lawrence County or the City of Louisa who are currently located in another state, other than for the exclusions in the Governor's executive order, shall report their presence to the Lawrence County Health Department and self-quarantine for 14 days.
- 2- All campgrounds public or private operating in Lawrence County shall cease doing business until further notice.
- 3- All public facing life sustaining businesses that remain open including but not limited to grocery, gas, and convenient stores shall develop and enact procedures that
 - a- Immediately impose limits of one (1) person from a family or group in the business at any given time. The order excludes minor dependent children of the parent/guardian when no other option is available. This order also permits one (1) adult to accompany and assist those with disabilities or elderly customers who require assistance.
 - b- Beginning Thursday, April 9th, 2020 at 12:01 AM impose limits not to exceed three (3) customers per 1,000 square feet of the facilities retail shopping space at any given time.
 - c- Beginning Thursday, April 9th, 2020 at 12:01 AM institute one- way movement through the business's aisles using floor markers or signage indicating proper directional movement.
 - d- Report non-compliant or unruly customers to the City of Louisa Police Department or the Lawrence County Sheriff's office.
- 3- Owners and/or managers of all public life sustaining businesses that remain open assume the responsibility of ensuring compliance with this executive order. This order shall be enforceable by the Lawrence County

Health Department, and if necessary the appropriate law enforcement agency.

This order shall be effective Thursday, April 8th, at 12:00 AM and shall remain in effect until further notice. This order is being enacted to ensure the safety, welfare and protection of the citizens of the City of Louisa and Lawrence County.
